When Northern Irishman and longtime Bermuda resident Roy Fellowes decided to create his own gin, he knew exactly what shade the spirit should be: pink. “The color is synonymous with Bermuda—we’ve got pink shorts, pink houses, pink skies, and pink sand beaches,” says Fellowes, whose Pink House Gin launched last year and is infused with botanicals like hibiscus, mint, and blood orange. THE HONEY BEE

Made with honeydew juice, rosemary-honey syrup, and Angostura bitters, this sweet highball is served at Marée Lounge, a clubby bar at the Loren at Pink Beach. thelorenhotel.com.



THE PARADISE CLUB

Inspired by a frothy pre-Prohibition cocktail called the Clover Club, this drink, which you can sip at The Conservatory Bar at Rosewood Bermuda, includes Campari, lemon juice, raspberries, and an egg white. rosewoodhotels.com.



LONGTAIL NEGRONI

It might take some doing to find the well-hidden Hamilton speakeasy Yours Truly, but when you do, try this Bermuda-inspired twist on the classic cocktail, made with Aperol, sweet vermouth, grapefruit bitters, and rose water. yourstruly.bm.



CARDINAL'S CLUTCH

Served at Hamilton seafood mainstay Barracuda, this spin on a French 75 has poppy cordial, fresh lime juice, and Peychaud's bitters, with a splash of champagne on top. barracudagrill.com.
